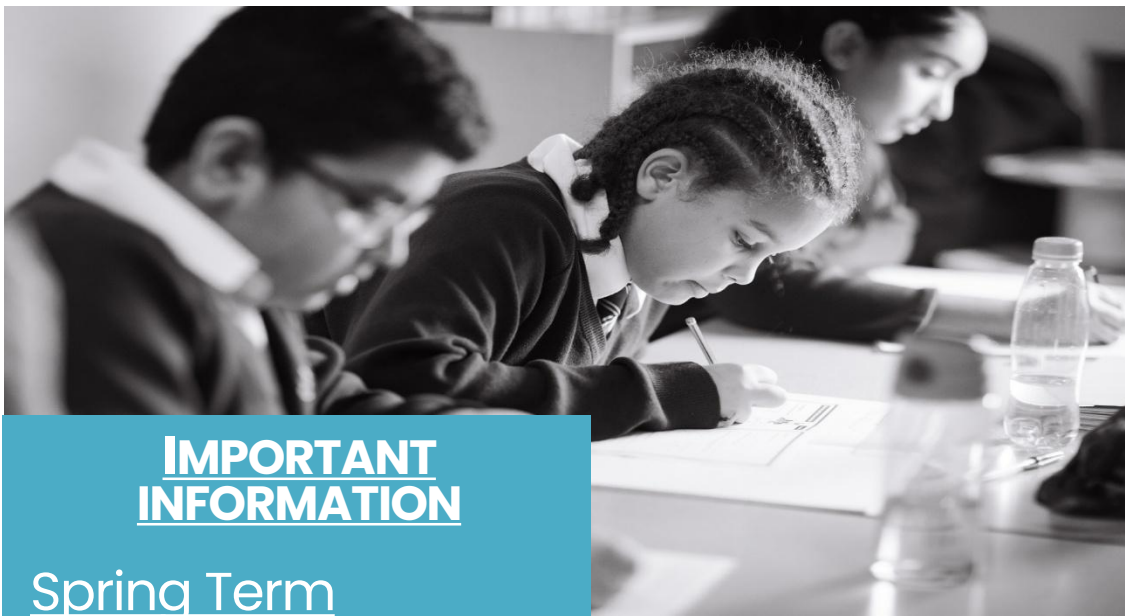

Eco News

We have established our Eco Council for 25/26 from Year 5 and 6 across both campuses. We have carried out our environmental review for our Eco School award this year. The review helps us decide on our focus topics for our reward submission.

We are fundraising for an environmental charity this year. We took a vote and the charity with the most votes was Young Climate Warriors, who raise awareness of climate change in schools. For our first fundraising activity we made some Xmas bouquets from donated flowers to sell at the Xmas Fayre and raised £109!

Next term we will be running an Eco afterschool club. This will run at the Town Hall Campus until February half term, then Britwell Campus until Easter. The club is open to all KS2 children, and we will be carrying our activities to improve our school environment and sustainability. Please check Arbor to book – there are limited places!

Attendance

A huge well done to all the children who achieved 100% attendance this term. They have each received a £5 Amazon gift voucher, and we hope they enjoy choosing something special over the Christmas break.

We have also noticed a rise in Withdrawal from Learning requests for extended holidays during the Christmas period. We completely understand that family time is important, but we do need to remind parents of the legal guidance around term-time absence:

First Offence - The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days Reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence - Within 3 years of the first offence, the second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for early payment.

Third Offence onwards - Within 3 years of the first offence, the third time an offence is committed for unauthorised term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Fines can be around £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found to be guilty in Magistrates' Court can show as a criminal record and also on the parent's future DBS certificates due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education.

We really appreciate your support in helping us maintain good attendance so that children can make the most of their learning.

Congratulations to Ali in Year 3, who won the star raffle prize which was a brand-new bike! We are proud to announce that we raised a fantastic total of just over £2,000. 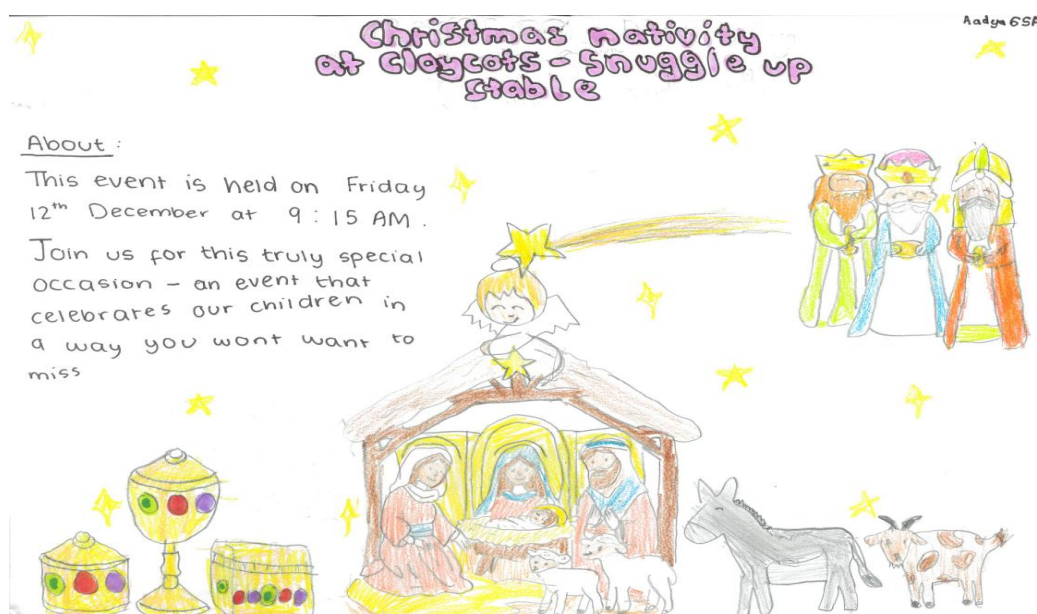

Music so far at Claycots

A message from your music teacher

Very well done to our new Reception students who have settled in so well to their music classes. I am hearing lots of talented little voices and cannot wait to see what the rest of the year holds!

EYFS were looking at Moving and Clapping

Reception sang songs and rhymes, moving in time to the beat. We listened to different styles of music, shared how they made us feel, and played instruments to a steady pulse.

In KS1 we were focussing on Pulse

In **Year 1** We explored pulse and tempo and learnt to feel the beat. We joined in call and response songs following a leader and practised pitch-matching.

Year 2 sang, played instruments and moved to music to develop their skills as musicians. We focused on pulse and tempo, finding strong beats and noticing changes in music.

The KS2 focus area was Performing: Reading Notation - Rhythm

Year 3 focussed on reading musical notation and they learnt more about rhythm and tempo. We practised reading, writing and playing rhythms and improved our singing skills.

In **Year 4**, we explored music in 2, 3 and 4 time, listening to a variety of recorded music and singing songs and rounds from around the world. We worked on a rhythm ensemble that used the rhythm "syncopa". Some key words we learnt were bar, bar lines, metre, minim and rest.



Year 5 studied music in 2/4, 3/4 and 4/4. We sang rounds, analysed recorded music, read and performed rhythmic phrases, and learnt technical rhythm names crotchet rest, paired quavers and semiquavers.

In **Year 6**, we developed rhythm reading and ensemble skills. We sang in parts, explored music from different genres, performed as a 4 part rhythm ensemble, and refined our ability to read and write rhythms.

What's happening in Extra-curricular?

Our Young Voices are practicing diligently in preparation for our performance at Wembley Arena in February - we have opened up more spaces in our after school choir. Come and join us for an unmissable opportunity to perform in one of the UK's most famous venues!
